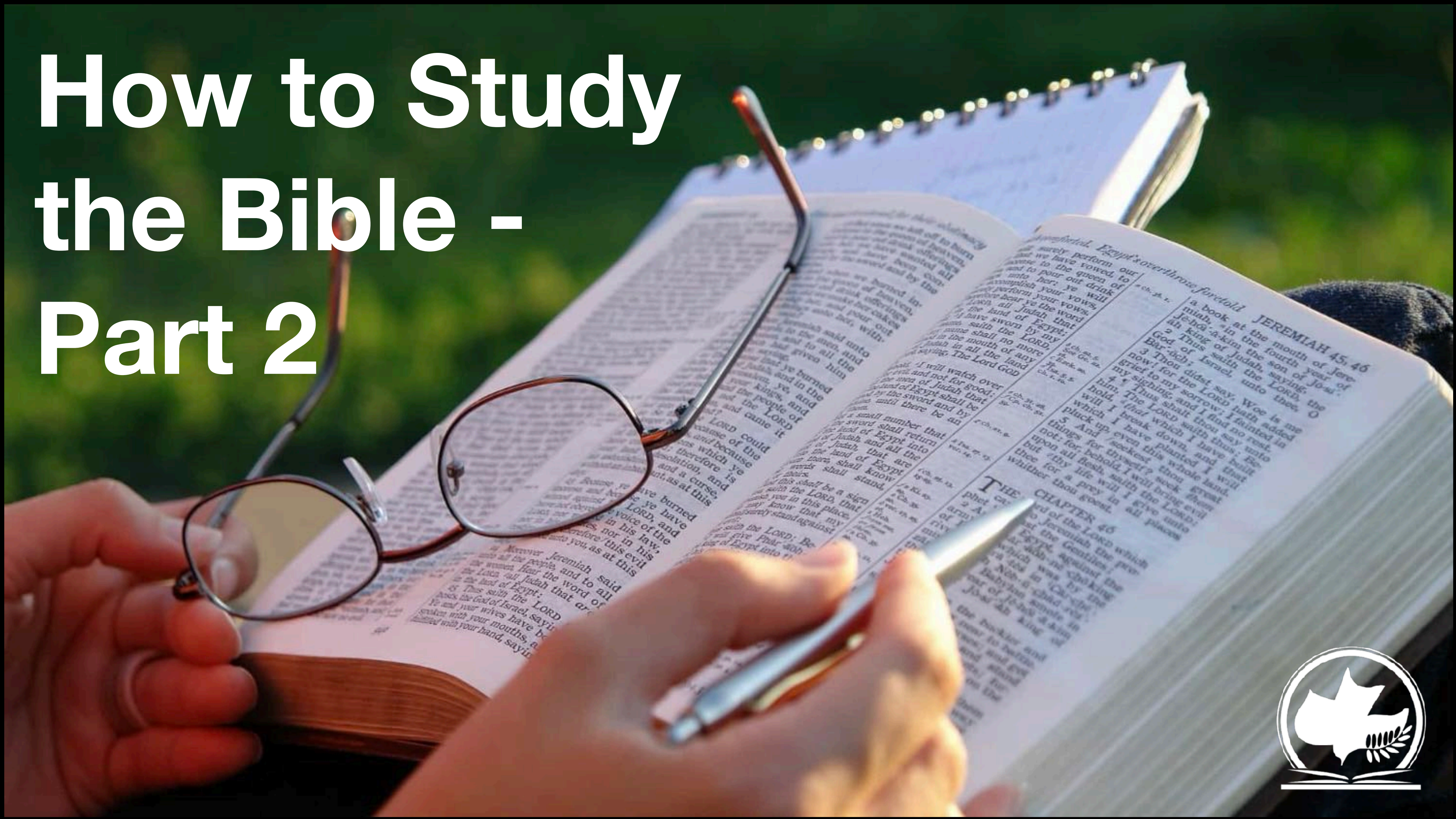

Common Bible Study Methods:

1. Inductive - Teaches what is in the Scripture; Pulls out what is there. **CONTEXT IS KEY/CRITICAL.**
2. Deductive - When you start with an idea and then look to find what the Bible says about it.

- 2. Observe what is written in the Scripture**
- 3. Interpret correctly what is written in the Scripture**
- 4. Apply prayerfully what is written in the Scripture to your life**

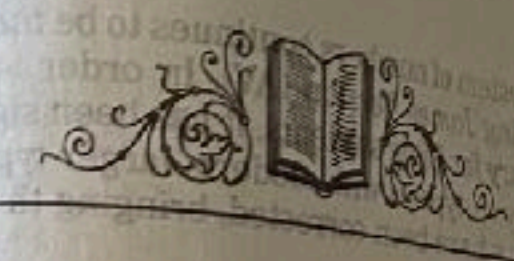

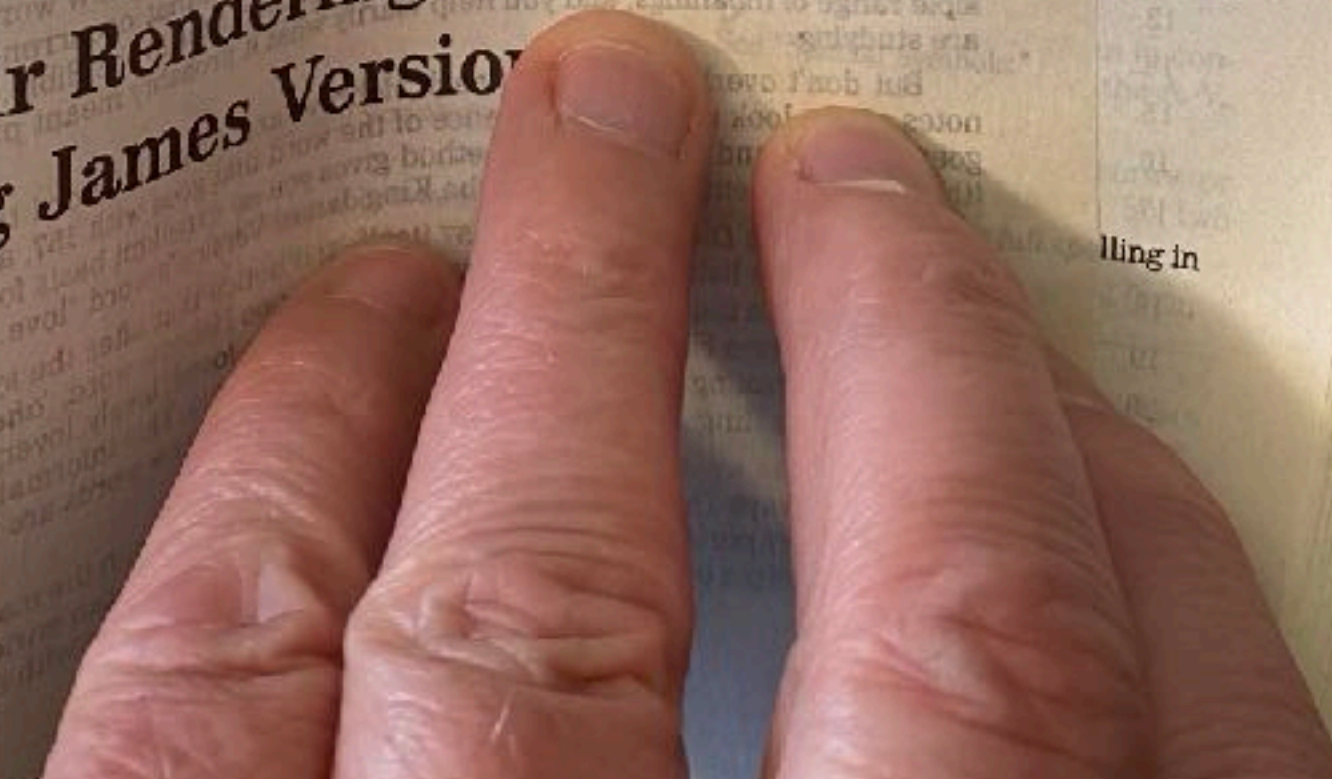
